


Data shows that people of Hispanic and Asian descent are less likely to gain access to services in Montgomery County. Jubilee's Breaking Barriers Project has partnered with the Maryland Developmental Disabilities Administration (DDA) and 14 IDD service providers to help tackle the barriers that people face when trying to connect with services.

Those who may need this assistance are people living with autism, cerebral palsy, Down syndrome or other developmental disabilities.
